

# The Gold Star Memorial Bridge:


Shaping New London's

Poorest Neighborhood

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#### **Brief Timeline:**

- Pre-19th Century Ferries
   (horse/steam-powered) carried cargo, luggage,
   and people across the river
- 1889 First railroad bridge was completed (an engineering masterpiece for the time)
- 1919 Second railroad bridge built to take high weight capacity (replaced 2008)
- 1943 First span of the GSMB was constructed
- 1973 Second span completed







### Effect On Immediate Neighborhood

- -First span led to many buildings, a church, a fire station, etc.(100 properties total) to either be destroyed or moved to other locations in New London or surrounding towns
- After the construction of the first span, Hodge's Square and the rest of Northern New London was cut off from the hustle and bustle of downtown N.L.
- -41.1% of N.L. population north of the bridge have an income below poverty level









## Only Public Access Close To Hodge's Square

-Boat launch (Residents don't have money for a boat)

- -Not nice and sandy like Green's Harbor Beach in Southern New London
- -Lots of concrete and rebar rubble left over from construction of bridges
